The massive growth of the Internet has made an enormous amount of information available to us. However, it is becoming very difficult for users to acquire an applicable one. Recommender systems filter information that is useful to a user from a large amount of information. Many e-commerce sites use recommender systems to filter specific information that users want out of an

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overload of information [2]. For example, Amazon.com is a good example of the success of recommender systems [1]. Over the past several years, a considerable amount of research has been conducted on recommendation systems. In general, the usefulness of the recommendation is measured based on its accuracy [3]. Although a high recommendation accuracy can indicate a user's favorite items, there is a fault in that only similar items will be recommended.
